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Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Celebrates Construction Kick-Off & 75th Anniversary

About 200 people attended a moving ceremony yesterday as Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes marked a \$500 million renovation and expansion and the hospital's 75th birthday.

The construction project will include a new, six-story patient care pavilion named in honor of philanthropist Marvin Samson. The Marvin Samson Foundation has pledged \$5 million—the largest gift in Virtua's history—in support of education and workforce development programs at Virtua.

Bishop Joseph Andrew Williams, the newly appointed head of the Diocese of Camden, led a ground-blessing prayer alongside the Franciscan Sisters of Allegany, New York (the hospital's founders) and local spiritual leaders representing a spectrum of faith communities.

"The creation of the Marvin Samson Pavilion is a key element of Virtua's ongoing investment in the well-being of this community," said Virtua President and CEO Dennis Pullin. "And equally important, the new pavilion affirms our commitment to providing advanced, accessible care to the region and beyond."

Samson, a Virtua board member and longtime supporter, is also the namesake of the Virtua Samson Cancer Center in Moorestown.

"I was raised to believe that each of us has an obligation to make the world a better place," said Samson, the son of immigrants who faced financial hardships while growing up. "I am excited that we are expanding Virtua's ability to impact the quality of life for members of this community."

Research Update: Thrive Renal Denervation Study

Virtua Research periodically shares trials for your consideration. A brief synopsis of the eligibility criteria is listed below. Physician colleagues are vital to the success of the research program, even when they are not participating as investigators. Kintur Sanghvi, MD, FACC, FSCAI, chief of interventional cardiology, director of cardiovascular innovation, and medical director of the Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital catheterization laboratory, is the principal investigator for this trial.

The **THRIVE** study is a pivotal, prospective, multicenter, 2:1 randomized, double-blind, controlled study comparing **TH**erapeutic IntraVascula**R** Ultrasound (T**IV**USTM) **RE**nal Denervation versus sham for the adjunctive treatment of hypertension.

The TIVUSTM system ablates the renal sympathetic nerves in the perivascular space using ultrasound energy. The study is intended to demonstrate the adjunctive effectiveness and safety of the TIVUS system in hypertensive subjects while subjects are maintained off of antihypertensive medications for a four-week wash-out period before RDN/sham procedure and two months after the procedure. Two months after the procedure, subjects with uncontrolled hypertension are put back on antihypertensive medication according to a medication escalation protocol. Unblinding will be performed at 6 months. Uncontrolled sham subjects can cross over to the RDN procedure at 6 months. The sham procedure will be minimally invasive to reduce the risk to subjects. All subjects treated with TIVUS will be followed for a maximum of 36 months post-procedure.

A brief synopsis of the eligibility criteria is listed below.

Inclusion Criteria:

- Documented history of hypertension
- Previously or currently prescribed antihypertensive therapy

Exclusion Criteria:

 The subject has been previously diagnosed with abnormal renal artery anatomy and/or renal anatomy such as single kidney, ectopic or horseshoe kidney, polycystic kidney disease, kidney tumors, or other findings precluding renal denervation therapy as detailed in the angiographic exclusion criteria

The remaining inclusion/exclusion criteria are extensive and can be shared by reaching out to our research team. If you have a patient who meets the criteria above, please contact the Virtua Research team at research@virtua.org and a research coordinator will review their eligibility with you.

Fracture Prevention Program Continues Successful Pace

As May is National Osteoporosis Month, Virtua continues to make strides in fracture prevention. Recognizing that less than half of fracture patients receive proper osteoporosis care, about a year ago, Virtua launched the Own the Bone Fragility Fracture Prevention Program at Virtua Voorhees Hospital, with plans to expand. The team recommends bone density testing and discusses treatment plans. With 215 patients enrolled since August 2024 and a 98% compliance rate, Virtua is set to achieve "star performer" status and will be featured in the 2025 *U.S. News & World Report* Best Hospitals Guidebook.
