Cardiac Milestone at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes

Virtua recently performed its 1,000th implant of the WATCHMAN™ left atrial appendage closure (LAAC) device. The WATCHMAN™ device is designed to reduce stroke risk and serve as an alternative to the lifelong use of blood thinners for people with atrial fibrillation not caused by a heart valve problem (also known as non-valvular AF or NVAF).

"This milestone represents an amazing accomplishment for our entire team and could not have been accomplished without their tremendous support," said electrophysiologist Darius Sholevar, MD, lead clinician of Virtua's Heart Rhythm Specialists.

Lannae Ewing, vice president of cardiac operations, added, "Reaching the 1,000th Watchman case is an extraordinary achievement and a true testament to the strength of our cardiovascular program."

Transform Trial Compares Strategies of Care for Cardiovascular Event Reduction

Virtua Research periodically shares trials for your consideration. The Transform trial is a prospective, controlled, randomized, open blinded endpoint, event-driven pragmatic trial in patients who are at increased risk for atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (CVD) but with no known symptomatic cardiovascular disease. A brief synopsis of the eligibility criteria is listed below. Physician colleagues are vital to the success of the research program, even when they are not participating as investigators. Mark Finch, MD, Medical Director, Advanced Cardiac Imaging, is the principal investigator for this trial.

The current primary CVD prevention strategy relies upon risk stratification using population health markers such as age, sex, diabetes, hypertension, dyslipidemia, and tobacco use, with preventive therapy intensified in higher-risk strata. Since these risk factors are indirect surrogate markers of the underlying disease, atherosclerosis, this strategy leads to the treatment of individuals with risk factors who do not have atherosclerosis and failure to treat those with significant atherosclerosis who lack risk factors.

The trial tests the hypothesis that a Cleerly Coronary Artery Disease (CAD) Staging System-based care strategy reduces CV events compared with risk factor-based care. The Cleerly CAD Staging System uses coronary computed tomography angiography (CCTA)-based visualization and quantitative analysis to categorize individuals' atherosclerosis severity. This trial is designed to address the unmet need for more accurate risk stratification of asymptomatic individuals at increased risk for CV events and to personalize their treatment based on CV risk estimates using CAD visualization and quantification. CCTA is a noninvasive imaging modality that enables the visualization and quantitative analysis and staging of the extent and severity of coronary atherosclerosis.

Here are just a few of the inclusion/exclusion criteria:

Inclusion—Men > 55, women > 65 years of age, Pre-diabetes, type 2 diabetes, or metabolic syndrome and have no symptoms of heart disease.

Exclusion—History of symptomatic CVD defined as prior MI, exertional or unstable angina, ischemic stroke, claudication, arterial revascularization for atherosclerosis, or other CVD being actively managed by a cardiologist, e.g. heart failure

The remaining inclusion/exclusion criteria are extensive and can be shared by reaching out to our research team.

If you have a patient who meets the criteria above, please contact the Virtua Research team at research@virtua.org and a research coordinator will review their eligibility with you.
