A Special Delivery for a Shared Birthday

July 1 marked the 75th anniversary of the first patient treated at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, and now the birth date of a very special patient.

Thaysnara, a mom-to-be with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, was ready to welcome her baby. Her pregnancy was carefully managed through Virtua's maternal risk program, which coordinates care and delivery for pregnant patients with high-risk medical conditions, including diabetes and cardiac disease.

Under the guidance of Shailen Shah, MD, lead clinician at Virtua Maternal Fetal Medicine, Thaysnara's delivery was carefully planned through interdisciplinary

meetings and with careful consideration of her cardiac history. The surgical team included Harsha Sharma, MD, OB/GYN and Danielle Wright, MD, OB/GYN, with Rhondalyn McLean, MD, cardiologist and AVP of clinical operations for VMG, and Eden Payabyab, MD, cardiothoracic surgeon, on standby, prepared for any cardiac considerations.

Throughout the delivery, Thaysnara, whose primary language is Brazilian Portuguese, communicated effectively with the medical team using a Cyracom interpreter. At 10:02 a.m., her baby girl, Isabella, arrived safely through a scheduled C-section. This successful delivery added a joyful note to the hospital's significant anniversary, which is further heightened because July 1 also marks the sixth year of Virtua and Lourdes coming Two-gether. Supporting Our Patients With Liver Disease & Substance Use Disorders

As many as 75% of liver transplants are a result of alcohol-induced hepatitis. That is why the liver care providers at Virtua Advanced Transplant & Organ Health have partnered with our Medication for Addiction Treatment (MAT) program to provide our community with treatment options that directly combat the urge to drink alcohol.

"Virtua's MAT program uses medication paired with behavioral therapy to help patients recover from substance use disorder. The program is particularly beneficial for patients with liver disease due to alcohol, as both our programs take a harm-reduction approach to care," said addiction medicine specialist Lynda M. Bascelli, MD. "We recognize that alcohol use disorder is a disease that should be managed just as any other disease, without judgment."

"This program positively impacts our patients and our communities," said transplant hepatologist Hisham ElGenaidi, MD. "Not only does it help transplant patients to qualify for a transplant and have a successful transplant surgery by helping protect the health of the donor organ, it also helps those with liver disease to avoid the need for transplant in the first place."

Virtua's plan is to grow these much-needed services via the region's first-of-itskind collaboration to address the full spectrum of physical and addiction-related needs in our communities.

Everyone, Always...Vigilant

As we approach the anniversary of last year's <u>CrowdStrike outage</u>, Virtua reminds us the importance of cybersecurity.

Virtua was among the thousands of organizations across the world impacted by the CrowdStrike outage last July. Some reports estimate that 8.5 million computers crashed during the incident, requiring airlines, banks, health systems, and other industries to enact rapid-response crisis mitigation.

Here at Virtua, our teams acted as soon as the problem arose. A multidisciplinary virtual command center was established, and IT staff deployed to all of Virtua's major campuses. As our IT division sought and applied technical solutions, other teams ensured patient care and access continued with minimal disruption—all while prioritizing HRO and a safety-first mindset.

"I've always believed that we can accomplish anything as a team at Virtua," said Tom Gordon, SVP and chief information officer. "We proved it in our response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and we proved it that week. During a period of uncertainty, we acted with purpose and speed to support our staff and our patients."

It's paramount for Virtua to be able to respond to such an emergency. That said, Gordon prefers that such an emergency not happen in the first place. He reminds everyone, always, to be vigilant when it comes to cybersecurity. "In our line of work, the lives of our community are at stake. Know and trust that behind the scenes, we are extensively monitoring and proactively preparing for the next emergency we hope never happens. But be aware of the security measures at your fingertips, even with a simple email. When in doubt, report it and reach out to IT."
