New Cardiac EP Area Dedicated at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes


Seeking to improve the experience of patients and families and inspired by the Culture of We, a multidisciplinary team spent months planning and transforming an underused area into a new clinical space serving heart rhythm patients at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital. Last week, Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital colleagues held a blessing and dedication for a new 5th floor electrophysiology lab and prep/recovery area.

EP patients can now be cared for in the same area, with their loved ones only steps away in a dedicated waiting area.

"I am moved by the Inclusionary Teamwork that this new team has shown and developed together. They demonstrate all of Virtua's Guiding Principles," said Gina Pinsky, BSN, RN, EP Lab nursing director. "Over the past eight months, the department has built sustainable relationships and shown incredible professionalism and empathy towards our patients as demonstrated by above-average NRC patient promoter and satisfaction scores. They truly exhibit the above and beyond actions and behaviors that should be acknowledged, modeled, and recognized."

Previously, patients arriving at the hospital for a heart rhythm procedure would need to travel across several units for prep, treatment, and recovery. The new unit creates essentially a one-stop shop that is certain to improve the patient and family experience.

Reminder: Compliance with COVID-19 Booster Requirement by Monday, April 11

In complying with Governor Phil Murphy's <u>Executive Order 283</u>, most Virtua colleagues and contractors must receive the COVID-19 vaccine booster shot by **Monday, April 11** or within three weeks (21 calendar days) of becoming eligible for a booster, whichever is later.

Note: April 11 is the compliance deadline for this initial group of colleagues, with the rest of our colleagues becoming eligible at various dates over the next several months (depending on when they completed their initial vaccine series; what type of vaccine they received for the initial series; and whether they have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days).

Hundreds of emails providing proof of vaccination have been sent to covidvaccinedocumentation@virtua.org over the past few weeks. We encourage you and your team members to continue sending in proof of vaccination so that you are accounted for.

Compliance: Beginning **Tuesday, April 12**, Human Resources will conduct a thorough reconciliation to determine who is eligible for the booster, covered by the Executive Order, and who has not yet complied. Additionally, Virtua will confirm COVID-19 positive status during this time, as individuals will have up to 90 days post-infection date to get their booster shot.

Upon completion of the reconciliation process, individuals who are deemed to be in a noncompliant status will receive a direct email communication (with a copy to the manager) notifying the colleague that they may be in a noncompliant status and must come into compliance immediately. Continued noncompliance may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.
