Latest Monkeypox News from the New Jersey Hospital Association


This week, the FDA issued an emergency use authorization (EUA) for the JYNNEOS vaccine to allow health care providers to use the vaccine for individuals 18 years of age and older who are determined to be at high risk for monkeypox infection. This will increase the total number of doses available for use by up to five-fold.

JYNNEOS, the Modified Vaccinia Ankara (MVA) vaccine, was approved in 2019 for prevention of smallpox and monkeypox disease in adults 18 years of age and older. It has been tested in individuals with immunocompromising conditions and has been found to be safe and effective in the trials that were performed to support approval. It was initially developed specifically as an alternative for use in immunocompromised individuals in the event of a smallpox outbreak.

According to the <u>U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, the total number of cases in New Jersey as of today is **277.**

COVID-19 Vaccination Impact on Morbidity and Mortality

A recent study published in JAMA Network found that COVID-19 vaccination was estimated to prevent 27 million SARS-CoV-2 infections, 1.6 million COVID-19-associated hospitalizations, and 235,000 COVID-19-associated deaths among vaccinated persons 18 years or older from Dec. 1, 2020 to Sept. 30, 2021. By Sept. 30, 2021, vaccination prevented an estimated 52 percent of expected infections, 56% of expected hospitalizations and 58% of expected deaths. The results indicate that the U.S. COVID-19 vaccination program was estimated to prevent substantial morbidity and mortality through direct protection of vaccinated individuals.
