Advanced Drug-Coated Balloon Now Available to Treat Peripheral Artery Disease

Virtua now has yet another next-generation, state-of-the-art tool to help individuals with peripheral artery disease. The SurVeil™ drug-coated balloon (DCB) was recently approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for percutaneous transluminal angioplasty. The best-in-class technology includes a proprietary drug-excipient formulation for a durable balloon coating. The design is intended to provide more uniform drug distribution, better efficiency of drug transfer, and fewer downstream particulates and emboli.

Ibrahim A. Moussa, DO, FACC, FSCAI, RPVI, director of Virtua's Structural Heart Program, was principal investigator for a clinical trial of the device at Virtua. Dr. Moussa and his research team were recognized by the sponsor as helping to achieve this historic milestone.

"This is good news that the Surveil DCB will be available to us to treat our patients," said Dr. Moussa. "Clinical trials have shown that the Surveil DCB successfully demonstrated safety and effectiveness at two years post-treatment with a substantially lower drug dose. We strive to offer our patients the most advanced devices and evidence-based treatments that can make a real difference in their lives."

Workforce and Patient Safety Update

Safety is a priority at Virtua, and we continue to take measures to maintain a safe environment for all. Here are a few highlights from this year:

Virtua is providing all colleagues with safety resources and training. Recently, Virtua's Workplace
Violence Prevention Steering Committee rolled out a system-wide education program in
partnership with the Crisis Prevention Institute. As part of the collaboration, all colleagues are
required to complete our Virtua Workplace Violence Prevention Program two-hour education
module.

• The security team worked closely with the emergency department leadership team to provide 24/7 security coverage at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes, Virtua Mount Holly, and Virtua Willingboro hospitals, with Virtua Voorhees and Virtua Marlton coming soon. The Virtua Camden satellite ED has security officers in the treatment area from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. seven days a week, and 24/7 security coverage at the ED weapons-screening area. The Virtua Berlin satellite ED has an officer assigned 24/7.

Additional initiatives to support a safe environment are also underway for the weeks and months ahead. These include:

- Installing screening devices at all Virtua hospitals and the satellite emergency departments in Berlin and Camden
- Creating "touch down" spaces for police personnel at all hospitals, helping to enhance the presence of our law enforcement partners
- Adopting new equipment and technology in support of colleague safety both inside and outside our facilities
