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Virtua Gastroenterologist Urges Caution With New Blood Test for Colorectal Cancer

Last week, the FDA approved a blood test for colorectal cancer screening. The breakthrough in medical testing expands options for patients and could lead to more people getting screened. But a Virtua gastroenterologist offers words of caution. "While it's a step toward a less invasive and more accessible option, this blood test should not replace a colonoscopy in the majority of patients," said Charles Snyder, MD.

In studies, Guardant Health's Shield blood test could accurately detect tumors in the colon or rectum about 83% of the time. While able to detect DNA shed by tumors during treatable stages of colorectal cancer, the Shield test was only able to detect about 13% of advanced adenomas or precancerous polyps.

"Early-stage colon cancer and precancerous polyps can only be fully detected with a colonoscopy," said Dr. Snyder. "While this is a promising development, it's important to remember that colonoscopy is still the gold standard with the highest accuracy rate and the ability to remove precancerous polyps."

Since Shield could assist with increasing screening rates and early detection, patients and doctors should weigh the ease-of-use benefit compared to the decreased accuracy. An abnormal blood test will still need to be followed by a colonoscopy.

\$1.8M NIH Grant to Fund Pioneering Robotic-Surgery System

As reported in <u>Clinician Update on July 25</u> and now featured in <u>New Jersey Business Magazine</u>, Rowan University researchers and Virtua orthopedic surgeons are developing the first robotic surgery system designed to align fractured long bones, such as the femur. These bones often don't heal properly due to misalignment—causing pain, difficulty walking, and other long-term problems.

Mohammad Abedin-Nasab, PhD, and his research team have won a \$1.8 million grant from the National Institutes of Health to further develop the system and bring it to market. Christopher Haydel, MD, an orthopedic trauma surgeon at Virtua Reconstructive Orthopedics, is among those working on the project.

Dr. Abedin-Nasab is an associate professor of biomedical engineering in the Henry M. Rowan College of Engineering and the Rowan-Virtua School of Translational Biomedical Engineering & Sciences.
