# Clinician Update December 21, 2023

### New Masking Requirements at Virtua – Effective Immediately

Yesterday, Reg Blaber, MD, EVP and chief clinical officer, shared the following message regarding the return of masking during patient encounters and when meeting with colleagues in closed spaces (break rooms, meeting rooms, etc.)— effective immediately. Please see his message below:

"Like it or not, the 'tripledemic' is upon us! As we approach the holidays, you undoubtedly will notice those around you becoming ill with COVID, RSV, or the flu. Each day, more and more colleagues are calling out ill with respiratory infections, almost certainly related to these viruses.

"This new variant of COVID, JN-1, is more infectious than any of the previous strains. The infectious disease community has also noted that it seems more likely to result in hospitalizations amongst those who are immunocompromised. This is evidenced by the increasing number of individuals presenting with COVID to our emergency departments and physician offices.

"What is different about this moment is that influenza and RSV are also rising rapidly. Between the three viruses, all of our hospitals are at or approaching capacity, and we haven't even gotten to the height of holiday gatherings yet!

"This 'tripledemic' and the impact that it is having on our workforce's health and hospital capacity is forcing us to reinstitute masking during patient encounters and when meeting with colleagues in closed spaces (break rooms, meeting rooms, etc.)–effective immediately. At this time, this will not apply to visitors, but we will strongly encourage them to mask up for the safety of their loved ones.

"I am sure you are all expressing a collective 'Ugh!' at this new mandate. We all feel the same way. However, our first goal is to always to Be Here for Good, for each other and our patients. That starts with creating an environment that is safe for all of us, our patients, and their families."

## Virtua Vascular Surgery Completes 50th TCAR at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital

Just one year after starting its Transcarotid Artery Revascularization (TCAR) program, Virtua vascular surgery has completed its 50th TCAR procedure. The program started with a collaboration between Michael Lieb, DO, a vascular surgeon at Virtua Surgical Group, and Omar Choudhri, MD, a cerebrovascular neurosurgeon with the Penn Medicine Virtua Health Neurosciences Program.

"Virtua vascular surgery continues to offer the latest in care to our patients," said Dr. Lieb, who also serves as medical director of The Vein Center at Virtua & Non-Invasive Vascular Lab. "TCAR was originally designed for patients who are at higher risk of surgical complications due to age, medical comorbidities, or anatomical issues. It is now offered to appropriate standard-risk patients as well. This allows us to maximize both surgical outcomes as well as the patients experience."

TCAR is a clinically proven treatment option for carotid artery disease. It is a patient friendly hybrid endovascular procedure and incorporates the neuroprotection principals of carotid endarterectomy and the less invasive nature of carotid stents. It utilizes a system that temporarily reverses blood flow away from the brain, collecting any potential debris in the device filter, before returning the blood to a vessel in the leg. With reverse flow neuroprotection established, a stent is then implanted in the lesion for long term plaque stabilization and stroke prevention.

### Working to Improve Early Outcomes Following Total Knee Arthroplasty

Sean McMillan, DO, sports medicine surgeon at Virtua Orthopedics & Spine, was the primary investigator in a multicenter study that sought to investigate the effects of a topical plant-based polysaccharide (PSP) as an adjunctive hemostat to minimize blood loss and improve early clinical outcomes in patients undergoing primary total knee replacement.

"This was a landmark collaboration for us at Virtua and our patients," said Dr. McMillan, working alongside other top investigators nationally. "The outcomes show that by using this technique, the team was able to minimize postoperative swelling and improve range of motion within the first 10 to 14 days for our total knee patients."

# Virtua Prescription Coverage Transitions to OptumRx

Effective **Jan. 1, 2024**, Virtua prescription coverage enrollees and their dependents will transition to OptumRx for their pharmacy benefits, replacing CVS Caremark. This change aims to enhance the customer experience with pharmacy benefits.

Additionally, Virtua has partnered with RxBenefits, a dedicated concierge service, to support all pharmacy benefit inquiries. Colleagues can reach the RxBenefits Member Services Team from Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., by calling 800-334-8134, or emailing <u>CustomerCare@RxBenefits.com</u>.

Key points to note during this transition include:

- All colleagues and their dependents will be issued new OptumRx ID cards for 2024.
- Current pre-authorizations and remaining medication refills will be transferred to OptumRx automatically.
- You may use any retail pharmacy that accepts your OptumRx plan when filling short-term and 90day prescriptions (including, but not limited to, CVS, Walgreens, and Rite Aid).
- The Virtua Specialty Pharmacy (VSP), located at the Virtua Health & Wellness Center Berlin, will provide specialty medications under the Virtua medical and prescription benefit. For more information, contact VSP at 856-322-3080.
