New COVID-19 Trends Make Vaccination Ever More Critical to Containment

Today New Jersey reached another troubling milestone with a record number of COVID-19 cases, <u>shattering the record set just yesterday</u>, officials are urging people to take precautions with holiday gatherings.

Paul Minnick, president of Virtua Voorhees and Virtua Marlton hospitals, told Philadelphia TV station <u>CBS3</u>, "What we're hearing and what we're being told is that omicron is so much more easily spread. We're seeing it in younger patients, and we're seeing that community spread where many people having exposures are not vaccinated."

The latest wave of COVID-19 cases has challenged hospital staff in new ways as well. Like other Philadelphia-area hospitals, space is getting tight, but Virtua's hospitals are still able to accommodate everyone who shows up.

Within the first 10 days of December, the number of COVID-19 patients at Virtua's five hospitals spiked from 100 to 150, the vast majority of whom are unvaccinated.

"What's different at this point is that it feels unrelenting," Minnick said. He noted that many of Virtua's COVID-19 patients could have avoided illness by getting vaccinated.

The best way to avoid a January surge is for people to get vaccinated and boosted while also wearing masks in public and practicing social distancing—important precautions since about 40% of Americans remain unvaccinated.

Please encourage your patients, friends, and family who have not received all three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine to do so as soon as possible.

The new Burlington County COVID-19 Vaccine Mega-Site, located in East Gate Square in Mount Laurel, is open Tuesdays through Saturdays. Appointments can be scheduled in minutes at <u>www.virtua.org/vaccine</u>. The mega-site will be closed on Dec. 24 and 25, but will return to regular hours on Dec. 28.

A Late-breaking Message from Virtua Infection Control Officer Martin Topiel, MD:

Because of the ineffectiveness of the present available monoclonal antibodies to omicron, it is likely we will discontinue that medication service until we receive the supply of the new product that has activity against the new variant. Final decisions are in the works and further details are forthcoming.

The future depends on all of us and what we do collectively—for ourselves, for our families, for our colleagues, and our communities. It's not an either/or moment; it's an all-in-together moment.

"Let's use this season to rewrite the ending of this public health story once and for all. Roll up your sleeves so you can reach out your arms and embrace the new year with renewed hope in humanity."

Holiday Risk Assessment

Many of your patients may be inquiring about how to proceed with holiday plans. Granted, an online assessment is not the equivalent of medical advice from a trained professional and should be used for informational purposes only. But, we share it here as a good resource.

This <u>step-by-step risk assessment</u> was created by James McDeavitt, MD, executive vice president and dean of clinical affairs at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, and it is published in this <u>article by the</u> <u>Association of American Medical Colleges</u>. It asks the user to assign a point value to different factors, including whether anyone at the gathering is at high risk for severe COVID-19 and the rate of community spread (both in the place where the gathering is taking place and where visitors are traveling from). Once various factors are tallied, the user will receive a score that reflects the risk level of the plan.

In a similar fashion, *The New York Times* has created a <u>simple quiz</u> to give holiday guidance. It asks questions like "Are you traveling?" and "Is anyone in your gathering unvaccinated?" to help inform safe decision-making.

- As noted above, New Jersey is experiencing record-shattering new cases of COVID-19. Today there were a reported **15,482** new cases, and just yesterday there was a reported 9,711 confirmed COVID-19 cases, breaking the record for the most positive tests in any single day during the 22-month-old pandemic.
- The total number of cases as of 3 p.m. were as follows:
 - Burlington County: 54,003 cases
 - Camden County: 67,198 cases
 - Gloucester County: 37,654 cases
- COVID-associated mortality for Camden, Burlington, and Gloucester counties: 3,041.
- The state's Vaccination Overview dashboard reported 14,929,275 doses of vaccine have been administered.
