Now in Effect: New Continuing Medical Education (CME) Process

The Rowan-Virtua School of Osteopathic Medicine (SOM) is accrediting all Virtua Continuing Medical Education (CME) activities for physicians as of today, **Feb. 1**. New requests will continue to be coordinated by Virtua, but the Office of Continuing Education at Rowan-Virtua SOM will accredit the activity for *AMA PRA Category 1 credits*TM for physicians.  only option to obtain a certificate.
- Please email program documents to CME-CNE@virtua.org, including attendance records, the
 Regular Scheduled Series (RSS) tracking document to identify speaker dates with topics, and the
 completed "Disclosure of All Financial Relationships from Planners, Faculty, and Others" for any
 new speaker or planner.
- All current CME educational activities will require a new CME request form which will be
 provided via email to planners by next week. This form will require a physician planner to
 complete, review, and sign by Thursday, Feb. 29.

National Women Physicians Day Is This Saturday, Feb. 3

National Women Physicians Day is celebrated on Feb. 3 each year. It marks the birthday of Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell, the first woman to receive a medical degree in the United States in 1849. She was famously allowed to attend medical school as a joke, but had the last laugh when she proved everyone wrong about her alleged "intellectual inferiority." Dr. Blackwell became the first woman in America to earn her medical degree, and initiated the movement that helped women gain entry and equality in the field of medicine.

"This day recognizes not only Dr. Blackwell's dedication, but the strides made by generations of women doctors since that time," said Senior VP and Chief Medical Officer Dr. Jennifer Khelil. "We honor those who came before us, and we celebrate those dedicated physicians among us today. NJHCQI Issues Report on Advanced Primary Care

Advanced primary care is patient-centered and comprehensive. Providing such care requires sufficient resources and infrastructure to support effective care teams. The New Jersey Health Care Quality Institute (NJHCQI) led a focused examination of current primary care payment models in New Jersey and has released this report.

Mary Campagnolo, MD, is a board member of NJHCQI. The Virtua family physician and geriatrician, medical director for value-based programs and payer contracts for Virtua Medical Group, and former member of the board of directors (2020 to 2023) for the American Academy of Family Physicians, advocates for the support of advanced primary care. She participated in the NJHCQI work group of experts to create significant steps forward to support the delivery of advanced primary care in New Jersey.

"The report calls for much-needed changes to how we pay for primary care. The report also calls for better data collection and transparency regarding the physician workforce for fiscal and policy decision-making. It also promotes streamlining reporting on quality measures and recommends a core set of measures for use across payers."

Upcoming Microsoft Authenticator Go-Live

Virtua Information Services is in the process of updating our multifactor authentication application from Entrust to Microsoft Authenticator. We are excited about the benefits this transition provides to the organization, as Authenticator is a secure, intuitive, and an easy-to-use multifactor authenticator application. It will provide Virtua with additional capabilities around password-less authentication and eliminates the need for users to type in their username and password each time they need to authenticate.

All Virtua colleagues who presently use Entrust or SMS text messages to authenticate their access to the Virtua network MUST transition to the Microsoft Authenticator application or they will be unable to access the Virtua network remotely. In adherence with security standards and best practices, SMS text notifications will no longer be supported as a verification method.

The transition will take place in three parts throughout February. Please review the go-live dates below to see when each application will transition to Microsoft Authenticator for remote access, multifactor authentication. However, users are highly encouraged to complete enrollment as soon as they can. This will allow for a seamless transition and ensure no disruption to your remote access.

Enrolling in Authenticator is quick and easy. To enroll, follow the instructions in <u>this tip sheet</u>. Colleagues can also find a list of support resources, including FAQs and a troubleshooting guide. Thank you for your support and patience as we complete this important security upgrade.

Note: Once Authenticator is installed and you are enrolled, please be sure to have notifications turned on. Do not disable notifications or the application will not prompt you properly.

New Security Screening System Coming to Virtua Marlton

In a move to continue keeping our colleagues, patients, and visitors safe, Virtua is set to install the Evolv weapons screening system at the emergency department in Virtua Marlton Hospital. This follows the

successful installation of the same system at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, and the Virtua Health & Wellness Centers in Camden and Berlin.

The new metal detectors are equipped with advanced sensors, cameras, and artificial intelligence, supporting security personnel in the detection and screening of firearms and other weapons. This state-of-the-art technology effectively distinguishes between items of concern and common personal belongings such as keys and phones, doing so in real time.

Importantly, the screening equipment is designed to be discreet and efficient, ensuring that foot traffic flows smoothly. Visitors will not be required to empty their pockets or undergo a separate bag check, significantly streamlining the entry process. The system is capable of screening as many as 4,000 people per hour.
