Important Message Regarding Remote Access to Epic and Physician Link

Every clinician who remotely accesses the Virtua network needs to be aware of upcoming changes now taking place. Virtua is transitioning to Microsoft Authenticator as its multi-factor authentication protocol. All users that need to access Virtua applications, including Epic and Physician Link, **MUST** enroll in Microsoft Authenticator. Beginning, **Tuesday**, **Feb. 20**, **at 10 a.m.**, colleagues not enrolled in Microsoft Authenticator will **NOT BE ABLE TO ACCESS CITRIX OR EPIC, INCLUDING PHYSICIAN LINK, REMOTELY.**

"The good news is that completing Authenticator enrollment is straightforward," said Jim Gamble, MD, medical director for informatics at Virtua. "And we have provided resources to help."

Breaking news! Magnet® Status for Virtua Voorhees Nurses

Congratulations to the nursing staff at Virtua Voorhees Hospital upon the news today of their Magnet® recertification. This means that three Virtua Health hospitals have earned recertification with the highest honor in nursing excellence: Magnet® recognition. Only about 10% of hospitals nationwide have earned this prestigious designation from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

Virtua first achieved Magnet status in 2018 when it was a three-hospital system. The certification lasts for four years. Those hospitals—Virtua Marlton, Virtua Mount Holly, and Virtua Voorhees—are now each recertified by the ANCC.

To achieve Magnet status, organizations must pass a rigorous review that requires broad participation by leaders and staff, numerous reports, and extensive documentation. This process also includes on-site visits by the ANCC's Commission on Magnet Recognition.

Virtua Information Technology to Update Epic

Epic has changed its basic platform technology, moving from Hyperspace to a web-based platform called Hyperdrive. All Epic customers, including Virtua, must transition to the new Hyperdrive platform to take advantage of continued improvements and upgrades in upcoming Epic versions.

In preparation for this change, the Virtua Information Technology team is in the process of updating our current Epic system as well as any impacted applications and/or systems currently integrated with Epic. We are excited about the benefits this transition provides to the organization. It streamlines development, enables advanced capabilities, and allows for intuitive, optimized, and improved workflow efficiencies in new Epic versions.

For most users, we anticipate the impact of this transition will be a new modern look and feel. Workflows and documentation will be completed in much the same manner as they were before.

Virtua also gets to leverage lessons learned from other Epic organizations that have already completed this Hyperdrive transition. The move to Epic Hyperdrive will begin rolling out to various areas and departments throughout March and April. The Epic Hyperdrive transition will be completed no later than the beginning of **May 2024**.

Another Epic Year for MyChart

To wrap up another year of productive partnership, our friends at Epic generated a video that recaps some significant statistics of 2023. For instance, 310,000 appointments were scheduled in MyChart last year, and 130,000 potential adverse drug events were avoided thanks to medication administration safety checks. The video demonstrates the important impact EMRs provide to support us on the journey to high-reliability and to enhance our patient experience.

Update to Masking Protocol at Virtua

Reg Blaber, MD, EVP and chief clinical officer, recently shared the following update regarding masking during patient encounters or when meeting with colleagues in closed spaces (break rooms, meeting rooms, etc.). Please see his message below:

Virtua consistently focuses on following science, using community/state infection data as well as identified best practices in order to make decisions to optimize the safety for our patients and colleagues.

We have seen a steady decrease in the number of patients presenting with upper respiratory infections to our offices, urgent cares, and emergency departments. Thankfully, we have also seen the number of

colleagues calling out with a respiratory illness decrease, reflecting the falling prevalence of these infections throughout New Jersey.

In response to the decreasing incidence of respiratory infections in our community and hospitals, we are relaxing the "strongly encourage masking" policy throughout our patient care areas. This applies to both colleagues and visitors.

Those patients with upper respiratory symptoms and/or a positive test for one of the three viruses should wear a mask at all times, as should their caregivers. Further, we should continue to discourage anyone from visiting patients with active respiratory symptoms to avoid transmission of the virus to loved ones. For all others, masking will be subject to personal preference, but we should always comply with any masking request by our patients.

Thank you very much for your hard work and patience in navigating the "tripledemic" season of respiratory infections caused by Covid-19, Influenza, and RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus). We will continue to monitor the prevalence of these viruses in our community and communicate with you any new information and recommendations as they arise.

GLP-1 Medications to be Discussed at Educational Event Hosted by Virtua, Feb. 26

Commonly called glucagon-like peptide 1 (GLP-1) agonists, the Food and Drug Administration has approved formulations of GLP-1 medications for type 2 diabetes and chronic weight management. Virtua Medical Director of Endocrinology Jean Davidson, DO, will be virtually discussing this topic in depth at a non-accredited educational event on Feb. 26.

"This is a great opportunity for an in-depth look at the mechanism of action, titration, and the prior authorizations process of these drugs," said Dr. Davidson. "All clinicians are welcome."
