#### **Practicing Excellence for Clinicians**

Practicing Excellence is a web-based coaching program for all Virtua colleagues and members of our medical staff. It is a program designed specifically to help us reconnect to joy and purpose and create better connections with our teams and patients.

If you are receiving *Clinician Update*, then Practicing Excellence is available to you personally and professionally. Its official kick-off is in April, and we will all pursue specific learning programs together. Practicing Excellence builds skills to drive outcomes in well-being, experience, and leadership effectiveness through on-demand coaching in five-minute intervals. The programs deliver short, actionable skill-building videos via a mobile app to allow clinicians and staff to learn at the same time, with role-specific tips.

According to Virtua Chief Clinical Officer, Dr. Reg Blaber, "Practicing Excellence is about more than fixing problems. It's about establishing new ways of delivering care, communicating, and approaching life that lead to better outcomes. I've spoken to clinicians who are further along with Practicing Excellence than we are, and they have told me that their participation in this program has not only helped them find greater contentment and fulfillment as health care professionals, but more broadly as people."

#### Create a Practicing Excellence Account

Once you've watched the video overview, the next step is for you to register with Practicing Excellence. **Download the Practicing Excellence app** on your phone by following these simple steps. You can also register for and access Practicing Excellence on its website, but many users prefer the mobile app for its simple navigation and for the ability to engage with the content on the go.

#### Registration tips:

- While your Virtua email is preferred, please use whatever email address you use most often and prefer.
- When prompted to provide a join code, enter the word VIRTUA.
- You will be asked to provide an Employee ID number. That six-digit number should be on the back of your ID badge. If you do not know your ID number, you can enter any sequence of numbers (like 000000) and move ahead with the sign-up process.

Once registered, you will be automatically enrolled in the Virtua Health Welcome Program, which includes an introduction video from Stephen Beeson, MD, founder and CEO of Practicing Excellence, and an overview of what the overall program is all about. You may also see a video geared to your line of work—such as emergency medicine, for example. Enjoy exploring the platform and becoming familiar

with its features and functions. You do not have to take any additional actions until the Virtua-wide launch in April.

#### A Note to Clinician Leaders:

In order to support the system-wide rollout of Practicing Excellence, all leaders are asked to get a jumpstart by participating in a special program called *Leading the Patient Experience*.

If you are not yet enrolled in this program, please follow these steps:

- 1. Click on "Progress" in the main menu of the Practicing Excellence website or app.
- 2. Tap or select the "Join Program" button.
- 3. Enter the join code VIRTUALEADPX.

Most leaders are a few weeks into the program, but you can easily catch up by watching the initial handful of tips under "Part 1: Create a Cause." With that, you will be back on pace and can follow the week-by-week program roadmap, which is the best way to fully process and act upon the video learnings.


The goal is for all Virtua leaders to complete the *Leading the Patient Experience* program by the end of April. In fact, it is one Virtua's global goals for 2023.

- The rate of transmission in New Jersey was reported on Thursday as .80.
- The total number of cases reported as of 3 p.m. Wednesday:
  - Atlantic County 70,767
  - Burlington County: 114,270 cases
  - Camden County: 138,039 cases
  - Gloucester County: 69,911 cases
- COVID-associated mortality for Camden, Burlington, Gloucester, and Atlantic counties: 5,102.
- The state's Vaccination Overview dashboard reported 20,203,252 doses of vaccine have been administered.

#### **Mpox Stats**

As of the last posting, the number of probable and confirmed cases of mpox cases in New Jersey: **764**. As figures have also stabilized for Mpox, we will pause the weekly report at this time.

#### **COVID-19 Testing at Virtua Voorhees Hospital**

Virtua Voorhees Hospital—and <u>only</u> Virtua Voorhees Hospital—has adjusted its COVID-19 testing protocols. As of Feb. 21, only patients who present with COVID-19 symptoms or are suspected of having COVID-19 will participate in COVID-19 testing. This revised protocol changes the necessity of preprocedure and pre-surgical testing for surgical patients at the Voorhees campus; these patients (including same-day, post-op, and labor and delivery) will NOT be tested unless symptomatic.

<u>Universal testing will remain in place at all other Virtua campuses</u>. Importantly, any Voorhees patient being transferred to a different campus will require testing at the receiving site. For more information, click here.

# **U.S. News** Physician Survey Currently Underway

The annual *U.S. News and World Report* survey, which captures medical specialists' expert opinions on which hospitals provide high-quality referral care in their specialty, is in full swing. We have learned that invitations have been mailed to eligible physicians who are users of Doximity. If you have not yet received an invitation by email, expect to get one soon, likely, by the end of the week. The survey will continue into mid-March, and each physician will receive clear instructions in the email.

To be survey-eligible, a physician must be a Doximity user and must meet <u>U.S. News' eligibility criteria</u>, which are determined primarily by board certification in a specialty that *U.S. News* evaluates. While you are welcome to participate in this survey, there is no obligation to do so. But, we do appreciate your help in recognizing the hard work and dedication our clinicians put into providing the highest level of care. <u>Last year</u>, Virtua Health was recognized as high performing by *US News & World Report*, with Virtua Voorhees Hospital tying for the sixth-best hospital in the state.
