Virtua Clinical Research Team Continues Great Strides

2023 was a bountiful year of accomplishment for the Virtua Clinical Research Team. These researchers participated in 77 clinical trials, with 24 trials already on the docket for 2024.

"The scientific knowledge we gain today translates into improved care for patients," said Robert Post, MD, MS, FAAFP, who serves as medical director for research and CME, and is chairman of the Virtua Research Investigator Committee.

Clinicians serve an integral role in research at Virtua, which includes studies with potential new therapies for cardiovascular, pulmonary, orthopedics, hepatology, GI, gynecologic diseases, and nursing research. The rapid development of new drugs, therapies, and devices has created a dramatic increase in the number of clinical research studies that highlights the need for greater participation by clinicians. Surgeons, pathologists, radiologists, NPs, PAs, and many other specialists all help improve the clinical research enterprise even when they are not participating as an investigator.

"Also, with our Rowan collaboration, we have increased our range to include Rowan physicians, residents, and medical students," said AnneMarie Palatnik, DNP, RN, ACNS-BC, Vice President of Clinical Learning and Research. "We will soon include transplantation medicine and health equity. Grant funded trials have similarly taken a prominent place in our research arena. The future is bright, and we're finding great reward in what we are accomplishing as a team."

The trials are in many therapeutic areas, and the team will accommodate finding a study of your particular interest.
