

Virtua Performs Record Number of Organ Transplants in 2022

It was another record-breaking year for transplant volume. For the second year in a row, the Virtua Advanced Transplant and Organ Health team posted its highest numbers of transplants in the program's 48-year history. The team performed 82 transplants. The majority were kidney transplants, including six

procedures involving a living donor. Eighteen patients received a liver transplant, and four individuals received two organs (either kidney/pancreas or liver/kidney). In all, this represents 20% greater patient volume than in 2021.

"Our dedicated team knows that each ultimate act of kindness from our donor heroes supports our team's mission to perform lifesaving transplants," said Christine Palms, vice president of the Virtua Advanced Transplant and Organ Health service line.

"Having experienced transplant nephrologists and transplant surgeons makes it possible for us to accept organs that other centers might have to decline," said transplant nephrologist Dr. Anita Mehrotra. "This increases access to transplantation for patients on our list—particularly older patients who may otherwise not get any organ offers."

"We have a team that shares a common goal, which is to grow the transplant program by increasing accessibility to patients in need and providing personal, high-quality care," said Dr. Simona Rossi, chief of hepatology.

Virtua Welcomes 9,000+ New Babies, Recognizes Maternal Health Awareness

For the second consecutive year, Virtua welcomed more than 9,000 new babies to the family. In 2022, Virtua delivered 9,105 babies, just four shy of the record-setting milestone of 2021. Virtua has mother-baby units at three of its five hospitals and also provides a natural birth experience at its freestanding Midwifery Birth & Wellness Center in Voorhees, which opened in late 2021.

"We love being a part of so many families' stories," said Dr. Nicole Lamborne, vice president of clinical operations for women's health and a practicing OB/GYN physician. "While we celebrate these big numbers, we keep in mind that every patient, every child is distinct with distinct needs. Our goal is to provide exceptional birth experiences and to keep all of our new mothers and babies safe and healthy."

Because of its commitment to safe, equitable, and inclusive care experiences, Virtua participates in Maternal Health Awareness Day— this year on Jan. 23—a time dedicated to helping people learn about the maternal mortality crisis in the United States and what can be done to reduce the health risks to women giving birth.

The main causes of maternal death are C-section complications, hypertension, infection, and excessive bleeding during pregnancy, labor, delivery, or postpartum.

This past Monday, colleagues across Virtua Mount Holly, Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes, and Virtua Voorhees hospitals participated in providing awareness around the importance of education and patient communication in reducing health risks.

Virtua Mount Holly Advances Lung Care with New Robotic System

The team at Virtua Mount Holly Hospital has begun offering a leading-edge option for the detection and treatment of lung cancer. The new Ion robotic-assisted bronchoscopy system can access small, hard-to-reach lesions in the lungs—enabling doctors to catch lung cancer at its earliest, most treatable stages.

"The Ion system enables us to provide more patients with state-of-the-art lung cancer care right here in South Jersey, close to home," said interventional pulmonologist Mark Weir, MD.

The platform, developed by Intuitive Surgical (makers of the da Vinci robot), enables doctors to reach 80% to 90% of suspicious lung nodules—versus just 60% with traditional, non-robotic bronchoscopy. The technology also reduces the need for more invasive approaches like a needle biopsy through the chest.

The Ion is Virtua's second robotic bronchoscopy system, following the similar Monarch platform launched 18 months ago at Virtua Marlton Hospital.

"With two bronchoscopy robots, we're able to offer an integrated cancer-care pathway across our health system," added thoracic surgeon Matthew Puc, MD, program director for the Penn Medicine Virtua Health Cancer Program.

Virtua is the only organization statewide to offer both the Ion and Monarch devices. In fact, interventional pulmonologist Syed Riaz, MD, has already performed more than 100 robotic bronchoscopies at Virtua Marlton.

Policy Alert – Virtua Research Investigators

Speaking of research, be aware that if you are a potential or current investigator in a research study that is funded by the Public Health Service (PHS), you must comply with Virtua's policy on this matter. This <u>notification letter</u> by Dr. Reg Blaber, EVP and chief clinical officer, alerts investigators to fully understand what is required of the <u>Virtua Public Health Service (PHS) Research Financial Conflict of Interest Policy</u>.

This policy is designed to promote objectivity and eliminate bias in research and to ensure compliance with federal guidelines. The term "investigator" refers to any individual, regardless of title or position, who is responsible for the design, conduct, or reporting of PHS-sponsored research, or proposals for such funding.
