Virtua Successfully Achieves Recertification for LVADs

Congratulations to Virtua's Advanced Heart Failure team, led by medical director Tolulope Agunbiade, MD, at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital for this week receiving recertification by the DNV for the implantation of left ventricular assist devices (LVADs). This recertification highlights the continued excellence and commitment to quality care within the program. In just seven months of operation in 2024, cardiothoracic surgeons at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital successfully performed five LVAD implants.

Another Record Year for Transplant Volume

For the fourth consecutive year, Virtua Advanced Transplant & Organ Health has performed a record number of transplants. There were 139 transplants in 2024 at Virtua, 25 more than 2023.

"With advanced care options like our progressive patient and organ selection criteria to get patients transplanted sooner, and virtual organ crossmatching for faster donor organ matching, we continue to improve access to advanced organ care for the people of South Jersey and beyond," said Janine Vallen, RN, MSN, CCTN, APN-C, assistant vice president of Transplant Services. Virtua Welcomed 8,944 Births in 2024

This past year proved to be another banner one for births at Virtua's hospitals, especially in consideration of the national declining trend. While 2024 numbers are not yet known nationally, births in the U.S. have dropped by 17% since 2007. With 6,485 births at Virtua Voorhees, 1,820 at Virtua Mount Holly, and 639 at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes, for a total of 8,944, that is 14 above what was forecasted for the year and just 33 less than last year.

"This says much about the community's trust in us," said Nicole Lamborne, MD, MBA, FACOG, VP of clinical operations for Women's and Children's Services. "Each delivery is precious, and we are honored

to provide the expertise of our medical staff and the effective protocols to assure successful outcomes and exceptional birth experiences for parents and their newborns."

As just recently reported in <u>Clinician Update</u>, Virtua's three hospitals with maternity divisions are once again designated as "high performing" on *U.S. News & World Report*'s 2025 list of "Best Hospitals for Maternity Care." In addition, Virtua Mount Holly and Virtua Voorhees hospitals join Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes with their redesignation as Baby-Friendly birth facilities by Baby-Friendly USA, Inc.

Virtua Utilizing Risk Screening Tool in Surgical Prehabilitation

At Virtua, the Risk Analysis Index (RAI) is now a standard part of all pre-op visits for non-emergency surgery. The RAI is administered at all new patient VMG surgical visits (except bariatrics), electronically in MyChart as part of the visit check-in or on paper the day of the visit. It is a questionnaire that has been shown to be an effective method of risk-stratifying patients. By asking a strategic set of patient-focused questions, a risk score is generated, and that data provides critical information to the surgeon and patient prior to surgery.

"This provides invaluable insight toward pre-op decision making," said Howard Winter, MD, vice president of surgical practice and outcomes. "Unlike previous screening that could be cumbersome, the RAI is an efficient way to screen patients for their surgical risk levels so that surgeons can order measures to minimize those risks."

The RAI score is visible to the surgeon during the office visit via a BPA, which the surgeon must acknowledge to complete the visit in Epic. Answers to various questions on health history and lifestyle generate a numeric score. Scores over 37 have been validated over thousands of patients to correlate with at least doubling rates of postoperative mortality, complications, and readmissions. Thus, scores over 37 prompt the clinician to suggest additional orders, such as consultation of physical therapy, nutrition, and smoking cessation.

"It is anticipated that these prehabilitation measures, as well as standard pre-op medical optimization, will lead to better trackable post-op outcomes," said Dr. Winter, a colon and rectal surgeon. "It is paramount we identify surgical patients who have an increased risk for post-op complications, readmissions, or even death. Our mission is to heal our community and get them back to their everyday lives. This step will help us in that task."

Virtua Enrolling Patients in a Clinical Study on Hypertension Management

Virtua continues to enroll patients in the SPYRAL AFFIRM Clinical Study, which evaluates the long-term safety, efficacy, and durability of the Medtronic Symplicity Spyral™ Renal Denervation System in patients with uncontrolled hypertension and associated medical conditions. Virtua <u>first introduced the Symplicity</u> system a year ago at Virtua Mount Holly Hospital in January 2024.

"Increasing awareness is key to tackling the issue of hypertension given it is preventable, detectable, and treatable," said Virtua interventional cardiologist Kintur Sanghvi, MD, FACC, FSCCAI. "Virtua is pleased to provide the Symplicity blood pressure procedure to qualified patients and, starting now, to participate in the clinical study."

To date, Dr. Sanghvi and his team have performed the procedure for more than a dozen patients, and recent patients have also been enrolled in the study. The SPYRAL AFFIRM Clinical Study will enroll up to 1,300 patients worldwide and will monitor the participants for three years.
