Special Message from Leadership Regarding the COVID-19 Vaccine

In an email sent from President and CEO Dennis W. Pullin yesterday, June 30, Virtua leadership has determined that we will require all Virtua colleagues and medical staff members be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by **September 15, 2021**. Virtua will consider requests for reasonable accommodation based on religious beliefs or disability/medical condition on an individualized basis.

With the vaccine mega site winding down its service, we will provide new dates and vaccine locations next week along with a scheduling process so that unvaccinated colleagues can be accommodated in advance of this requirement. If you have already received a COVID-19 vaccine, you do not need to be vaccinated again, and at this time, no booster shot is required.

Virtua colleagues who receive the COVID-19 vaccine from a non-Virtua location must submit their vaccination information via email to: covidvaccinedocumentation@virtua.org and include your employee ID number and a photo of the CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card.

It's Fun to be Done!

Summer has arrived, and people are eager to participate in favorite summer activities that were put on hold last year. If you or your patients are looking to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at the Burlington County Mega-Site, please note that it will be closed for the Independence Day Holiday from July 2 to 5. The mega-site's hours of operation for the following week are as follows:

Tuesday, July 6, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday, July 7, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Friday, July 9, 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, July 10, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Please Note: Beginning **Friday, July 2**, the mega-site will only administer **unscheduled, walk-up first doses.** Anyone who receives a first dose at the mega-site after today will need to get their second dose at a different location. Fortunately, vaccines are readily available throughout the region. Consult the State of New Jersey Vaccine Locator for a full list. **However,** if you already received your first dose prior to July 2, your scheduled second dose will be administered at the mega-site.

Lung Cancer Breakthrough at Virtua—New Robot Accesses Small, Hard-to-Reach Tumors Virtua is the second health care organization in New Jersey to offer new, robot-assisted technology that enables doctors to catch lung cancer early—when it's most curable.

The robot-assisted bronchoscopy system enables our doctors to reach 80 to 90% of suspicious lung nodules—versus just 60% with traditional (non-robotic) bronchoscopy. The system also reduces the need for more invasive approaches.

Virtua interventional pulmonologist **Dr. Syed Riaz** has already used the technology at Virtua Marlton. Patients will typically receive the procedure after a low-dose CT finds a suspicious area, even if they don't have any signs of lung cancer yet.

At the <u>Penn Medicine</u> | <u>Virtua Health Cancer Program</u>, nurse navigators help patients schedule their CT scan. If the scan shows a suspicious area, the navigator can arrange a robot-assisted bronchoscopy to check for cancer. And if cancer is found, the patient can receive care from the program's pulmonologists, oncologists, and surgeons.

Enhanced Access for Health Care for the Military: Virtua Launches "Here to Serve"
