Colleagues Attend Ion Open House

Thank you to everyone who stopped by our open house for the Ion bronchoscopy robot newly introduced at Virtua Mount Holly Hospital. Interventional pulmonologist Mark Weir, MD guided colleagues and visitors as they controlled the robot and explored a model of the lungs.

This robotic-assisted bronchoscopy allows physicians to access all 18 segments of the lung and enables minimally invasive biopsy. By using this robot, physicians can reach 80 to 90% of suspicious lung nodules and reduce the need for more invasive approaches like a needle biopsy through the chest.

Virtua I.T. Cyber Threat Alert: What to Watch For

The Virtua I.T. department wants to draw attention to a series of phishing attacks carried out by cybercriminals aiming to deceive recipients.

Key points about these phishing attacks:

- The email lures may have sender names like HR Alerts or HR Department, but the actual sending address will not be associated with our company or HR department.
- Recipients are typically urged to take immediate action regarding an HR assignment or alert by clicking on a malicious link. This can lead to the download of a zipped .url file or a PDF attachment.
- Watch out for notable grammatical or syntactical errors in these phishing emails, as they are common indicators of a scam.

STOP, THINK, and ACT:

If on Virtua email you come across any suspicious emails, click:

- The Report Phish button within the Outlook application.
- The Report Phish button within Outlook webmail.
- The new Report Suspicious button within the email body.

Please remember that we occasionally conduct phishing simulations to assess the potential impact of real attacks. If you encounter any emails matching the tactics described above, report them promptly. If a reported message turns out to be a simulation, you'll receive a notification indicating so. No further action will be necessary.

However, if a reported message is not a simulation and involves a time-sensitive request, take extra steps to verify its validity before acting on it.

Tips to remember (at work and at home):

- Stay cautious of emotionally charged emails. Cybercriminals often use HR warnings or alerts related to payroll issues to pressure recipients into interacting with malicious links or attachments.
- Be alert for phishing indicators. Sending addresses that don't match our organization's name or obvious spelling and grammatical errors should raise suspicions.
- Always verify the legitimacy of unsolicited or unexpected emails, especially if they instruct you to click on links or download files. If anything seems off, report it—don't ignore it.

Important Apple Device Security Update

Apple recently sent out an alert requiring devices to be updated to the latest version.

We are requiring everyone using an Apple device whether they are personal or Virtua issued (i.e. Epic Rover, Home Care, Telemedicine) to apply the latest update (version 16.6), released from Apple, to patch a critical vulnerability.

Due to these important Apple security updates, any device without the required release version will be restricted from synchronizing Virtua email for security protection reasons.

If your device version is less than 16.6. for iOS/iPadOS or 11.7.9 for macOS Big Sur, macOS Monterey versions prior to 12.6.8, and macOS Ventura versions prior to 13.5, your device is at risk of being compromised.

What does this mean?

- Apple has identified two vulnerabilities that are being actively exploited. The latest update addresses both vulnerabilities.
- Attackers that successfully exploit these vulnerabilities can steal data or install malware onto your device.
- This puts your personal information as well as confidential Virtua information at risk.

What do I need to do?

Apply the latest software update to your personal device.

Which updates do I need?

- iOS and iPadOS to version 16.6. or higher
- 11.7.9 for macOS Big Sur,
- macOS Monterey versions prior to 12.6.8
- macOS Ventura versions prior to 13.3.1

How do I check which version I have?

How do I update my device?

• Refer to this article: <u>Update your iPhone</u>, <u>iPad</u>, <u>or iPod touch</u>

What if my device is an older model and cannot update to the required versions?

- Acquire a device that is compatible with the required versions of iOS and macOS.
- Certain older devices will not support the latest iOS upgrade and unable to patch.
- Certain older devices will not support the most current critical security updates.

Why can't I continue to use my current/older device without the upgrade?

 Any device without the required security updates will be restricted from synchronizing Virtua email for security protection reasons.

A few tips to keep in mind:

- Do not download, accept, or execute files from untrusted and unknown sources.
- Do not visit untrusted websites or follow links provided by untrusted or unknown sources.
