Dr. Riaz Completes 50 ION Robotic Bronchoscopies in 50 Days

Virtua interventional pulmonologist Syed Riaz, MD, recently completed his 50th robotic bronchoscopy case with the ION navigation-guided technology—in just 50 days! This is the fastest anyone has reached this landmark across Virtua, compared to all previous navigational bronchoscopy platforms used by the health system to date. The procedures took place at Virtua Marlton Hospital.

Robotic-assisted bronchoscopies enable our doctors to catch and treat lung cancer early—when it's most treatable—allowing them to reach 85% to 90% of suspicious lung nodules versus just 50% to 60% with traditional, *non*-robotic bronchoscopy.

"This tool makes it easier to diagnose even small, hard-to-reach growths in the lungs," said Dr. Riaz. "The overall number of cases is not as important as each individual one. I am so grateful for our team and all we are doing for our patients."

Virtua Adds Leading-Edge LVAD Procedure for Heart Failure

The advanced heart failure team at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital has performed the health system's first left ventricular assist device (LVAD) implantation. LVADs help maintain heart function for people with end-stage heart failure. The surgery took place in May and the patient is recovering well.

"The LVAD can support patients for the long term or serve as a bridge for individuals who may later be a candidate for a heart transplant," said Tolulope Agunbiade, MD, medical director of Virtua's Advanced Heart Failure Center. "Our goal is to continually expand our capabilities and capacity so that South Jersey residents can receive highly specialized care close to home."
