Virtua Teams Honored by the American Heart Association

The cardiologists, hospitalists, and nurses at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital have been honored by the American Heart Association for the third consecutive year for achieving the Get With The Guidelines®—Heart Failure Gold Plus with Target: Heart Failure Honor Roll and Target: Type 2 Diabetes Honor Roll.

"I am so proud of our clinicians and teams at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital," said Theresa Rowe, MSN, CRNP, director of Heart Failure Services at Virtua. "This is really not just about the award, but about the commitment our teams have shown to ensure we are following national guidelines, which represent excellence in care. This honor also lets the community know that we follow standards that ensure patients are receiving guideline medical directed care, which have shown to reduce cardiovascular death, as well as decrease HF hospitalizations."

Additionally, Virtua Home Health Care achieved certification from the American Heart Association for its heart failure program. Virtua is only the eighth home care agency in the nation and the sole one on the East Coast to receive this esteemed recognition.

The Virtua Home Care heart failure program is dedicated to delivering exceptional care to patients with heart failure. Virtua home care nurses provide treatment and education to patients, ensuring they receive the necessary support and monitoring within the comfort of their own homes. Through the program, patients have access to a team of specially trained nurses, social workers, dietitians, therapists, and other staff who provide a range of services, including medication management and nutrition education. The team works closely with the patient's cardiologist or primary care physician to ensure continuity of care.

Virtua Former VP for Physician Services and Chief Medical Officer Honored

James Dwyer, DO, has been honored with the WE Award for Outstanding Board Leadership. He is vice chair of the Virtua Board of Trustees, and chair of the Board's quality and safety committee. Virtua Health honors select individuals with WE Awards as a way of acknowledging those who go above and beyond what's expected in order to provide an outstanding experience or outcome for our patients and community.

Dr. Dwyer served as a major in the Army and oversaw the emergency room at Walson Army Hospital at Fort Dix, earning an Army Commendation Medal. The internist and rheumatologist rose to many leadership roles to eventually serve as executive vice president for physician services and chief medical officer.

Dr. Dwyer's attention to quality and safety brought about national change. When appointed to the National Committee for Quality Health Care as the co-chair of the Performance Measurement Tools Task

Force, he helped create a CEO Survival Guide for the measurement of health care quality to assist health systems nationwide.

"I have gained a deep respect for our clinicians at Virtua and the impact that they have had through the years and to this day to make Virtua such a special place.
