

- The total number of cases reported as of 3 p.m. today:

 - o Camden County: 103,243 cases
 - Gloucester County: 54,158 cases

Cybersecurity: What You Need to Know

Cybersecurity is critical, now more than ever. Detecting and reporting suspicious activity is essential on everyone's part as these cyberattacks continue to escalate due to the conflict between Russia and the Ukraine. We have asked Lou Dignam, AVP of information security at Virtua, to answer some important questions regarding cybersecurity and our collective role in it. What is a cyberattack? Where are cyberattacks coming from, and what is their goal? A cyberattack is an attack launched from one or more computers against another computer, multiple computers, or networks. The goal of these attacks can vary, but in simple terms, the attackers aim to be disruptive by taking the targeted system offline, accessing its information, ransoming encrypted data, extorting money, or stealing and selling the data.

How damaging are these cyberattacks? Health care was a big target for attackers in 2021 and the concern is this will continue to grow. Last year alone, over 40 million patient records were known to be compromised in the United States, and many more were suspected to be unreported. Some of these incidents have taken down networks for weeks at a time and have led to disruptions of care, and loss of millions of dollars.

Cyberattacks can target each of us in the form of a "suspicious" message, sometimes easy to miss. What are the threats Virtua is currently seeing? Attackers are always looking to take advantage of situations (such as tax season, world events, the pandemic, disasters, etc.) to scam unsuspecting victims. They like to use specific personal information to make their messages look legitimate. This messaging can come in a variety of forms—phishing, smishing, and vishing. We have seen examples of all three of these coming to Virtua staff, mostly through email which is defined as phishing.

How extensive are Virtua's layers of cyber defense? Virtua has made a great investment in protecting our patients and resources. That said, no one solution can truly protect against all attack vectors or plug every security hole in the organization.

What about our individual role in cyber defense at Virtua? Cybersecurity is everyone's responsibility. Stay vigilant! Everyone should maintain a heightened posture when it comes to cybersecurity and protecting the organization and your own personal data. If an email looks suspicious, DON'T DELETE IT, REPORT IT. It is not a harm to open the email, just don't click on any of its links or open any of its attachments. Use the Report Phishing button in Outlook or forward it to reportphish@virtua.org.
