Haiku: Enhancing the Power of Connection

Have you installed Haiku yet?

As we prepare for the transition to Epic Secure Chat from QliqChat, clinicians currently using QliqChat on their mobile phone must prepare for this transition by installing the Haiku mobile application, if they haven't already. Haiku is the platform that Epic Secure Chat uses to send and receive messages.

"Haiku also provides easy access to chart review, patient lists, schedules, and more," said Samir Doshi, MD, FAAP, associate medical director of informatics at Virtua. "It's a great tool to keep you connected to your practice and your fellow physicians 24/7."

To download and register Haiku:

- While using the mobile device you wish to add Haiku to, visit the Virtua Digital 411 site.
- Click on the "Virtua Haiku Activation Instructions" link in the right-hand column.
- Follow the instructions listed there.

Please note that it may take 24 to 48 hours for your device to be activated after it is registered.

Also, please be aware that you must at minimum have Apple iOS version 16 or Android OS version 11 to use Haiku on your mobile device.

Virtua Awarded Thrombectomy-Capable Stroke Center Certification

Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, in strategic alliance with Penn Medicine, has earned two prestigious designations for its advanced stroke care. The Camden hospital recently received The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® and the American Stroke Association's Heart-Check mark for Thrombectomy-Capable Stroke Center Certification.

"Ischemic stroke, when a blood clot blocks blood flow in the brain, accounts for about 87% of all strokes. Mechanical thrombectomy is an advanced procedure to surgically remove the clot quickly and safely, restoring blood flow to the brain," explained Omar Choudhri, MD, a cerebrovascular surgeon with the Penn Medicine | Virtua Health Neurosciences Program and an assistant professor of neurosurgery at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.

"The stakes are high and every minute counts," Dr. Choudhri added. "That's why we train to identify, prep, and treat these patients as quickly as possible from the moment they come into the emergency department."

New Simulation Center Enables Enhanced Surgical Training

Virtua has created a simulation center to train surgical residents and staff members on operating room procedures. Warning Issued to All iPhone Users

Virtua is requiring everyone using an Apple device, whether they are personal or Virtua-issued, to apply the latest update released from Apple to patch a critical vulnerability. iOS 17.4 fixes at least four security issues, two of which are already being used by attackers. The two exploited vulnerabilities are both kernel memory protections flaws which allow an attacker to bypass operation system protection. An attacker could then install programs, view, change, or delete data, or create new accounts with full user rights.

In addition, Apple also patched a privacy flaw in the Accessibility feature that could allow apps to read sensitive location information.

Best Practices for Media Relations

To encourage a cooperative flow of information between Virtua and the news media, all media inquiries must be directed to the media relations team within the marketing department. Similarly, colleagues should not contact the media directly. The definition of media includes podcasts and blogs, in addition to more traditional outlets like television/radio stations, magazines, and newspapers.

The media relations team also can support colleagues in differentiating earned-media opportunities from "pay-to-play" scenarios (that often appear to be legitimate news inquiries at first glance). For instance, there are many publications that will offer to create profiles/articles/features for a fee or in exchange for paid advertisements/sponsorships. Sometimes the opportunity is free for Virtua but requires monetary support from our partners or contractors (which conflicts with our philanthropic priorities).

Occurrence Reporting Now in Epic

Colleagues who use Epic have mentioned it takes additional steps to place a safety event or good catch in the occurrence reporting system when they are using Epic. They've requested a more straightforward method for reporting occurrences, aside from initiating it via the Colleague Corner.

There is a new shortcut on the right-hand side of the Epic yellow tool bar. The link will directly lead users to the RL Datix occurrence reporting system. You can then log in and submit your report as usual.
