Epic and Clinical Updates Now Launching for Virtua Reconstructive Orthopedics

On **Monday, June 3**, Virtua Reconstructive Orthopedics practices will go live with Epic and other Virtuastandard applications and technologies. Virtua will also launch Imprivata PatientSecure palm vein scanning at all the same locations.

The transition means that all clinicians system-wide may soon notice converted Virtua Reconstructive Orthopedics data in their patients' charts. The conversion of the data is a standard part of the project as seen with previous additions to the network.

As for the palm vein scanning launch, PatientSecure is a biometric technology device that identifies each patient using the unique characteristics of their palm veins. Palm vein scanning provides a fast and safe way to correctly identify each participating patient and accurately link to their medical record.

Rollout of palm vein scanning will continue system-wide in a phased approach throughout 2024.


The issue follows the case of a 62-year-old patient who is now doing well, with dramatically less chance of the catastrophic aortic event that had threatened his life. "This case highlights how we can address the whole aorta in a stepwise fashion if needed, according to disease progression," said Virtua fellowship-trained cardiothoracic surgeon, Eden Payabyab, MD.

This issue also introduces the experienced cardiac surgeons who are advancing surgical capabilities at Virtua. Arthur Ng, MD, recently joined Virtua from Hackensack University Medical Center, and Michael Lee, MD, joined Virtua's heart care team after completing his cardiothoracic surgery and structural heart fellowships at Brigham and Women's Hospital.
