A First in Nation by Virtua

Clinical Trial Advances Treatment for Leading Cause of Cardiac Arrest The cardiac team at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital recently became the first in the nation to implant an investigational defibrillation lead designed to treat people with ventricular tachycardia (VT.

Virtua is one of 47 hospitals worldwide participating in a clinical trial called Lead Evaluation for Defibrillation and Reliability (LEADR). The LEADR study, sponsored by Medtronic, will evaluate the safety and effectiveness of an investigational, catheter-delivered lead in adult patients who have previously experienced, or are at significant risk of developing, VT. The lead is paired with commercially available Medtronic defibrillators.

"By participating in the LEADR study, we are helping drive patient care forward," said Virtua heart rhythm specialist Aatish Garg, MD, who performed the first procedure with Darius Sholevar, MD, Virtua chief of electrophysiology and principal investigator.

The investigational lead is 1.6 millimeters in diameter, which means that it takes up less space in the veins compared to commercially available leads that are implanted with ICDs today.

"One of the issues we encounter with the larger leads used in ICDs is that the scar tissue that builds up around them over time can cause the veins in which they are inserted to become occluded," said Dr. Sholevar. "This investigational lead is thinner."

In order to continue to provide the best possible care to our patients, Virtua Health system remains committed to outstanding quality care and ongoing clinical research.

"Research is a critical part of cutting edge care in medicine," said Dr. Sholevar. "In the Virtua Health System, the hard and diligent work of the research physicians and coordinators give our patients access to novel therapies that would not otherwise have been available."



Webinar for Operation Allies Welcome



Europe is Back at the Epicenter of the Pandemic

WHO Urges Americans to Take Note

According to a <u>New York Times</u> report, the World Health Organization (WHO) said Europe is again experiencing near-record levels of coronavirus cases, and could experience 500,000 COVID-related deaths in the next three months.

Dr. Hans Kluge, WHO's director for the 53 countries in its European region, said there were 1.8 million

new cases and about 24,000 deaths in the past week.

"We are at another critical point of pandemic resurgence," Dr. Kluge said. "Europe is back at the epicenter of the pandemic—where we were one year ago."

Dr. Kluge said the virus was surging because precautions like mask-wearing were relaxed and too few people have been vaccinated. Hospital admission rates were high, he said, in the countries where vaccination rates were low.

Dr. Kluge told <u>CBS News</u> that Americans should be paying close attention to the situation in Europe right now—and taking lessons from it. He said, "The basic principle is, if there is a situation where the peak is accelerating, don't wait" to bring back anti-virus measures, and "the earlier, the stricter, the better."

Final Call for COVID-19 Vaccinations at the HEC

Before the month is over, the state and its partners will open a new Burlington County COVID-19 Vaccine Mega-Site in Mount Laurel. As with the Moorestown mega-site, Virtua will proudly serve as the health care lead for this forthcoming facility.

In order to staff and support the mega-site, Virtua will discontinue its vaccine clinic at the Barry D. Brown Health Education Center (HEC). **Next week is the final opportunity for Virtua colleagues and their children/dependents to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at that location.**

The dates are as follows:

- Tuesday, Nov. 16: Moderna boosters
- Wednesday, Nov. 17: Pfizer boosters
- Friday, Nov. 19: Pediatric Pfizer doses (for the children/dependents of Virtua colleagues ages 5 to 11)

Note: Virtua invites eligible colleagues who received their initial vaccine series at the original mega-site to schedule a booster appointment at the HEC. These individuals can email <u>covidmegasite@virtua.org</u> with their name and cell phone number to request an appointment between 8 a.m. and 1:45 p.m.

As always, colleagues should bring their CDC-issued vaccine record card to their booster appointment. All visitors to the HEC, including children, must wear a mask throughout their visit.

Update to Virtua's Visitation Policy

Virtua has now resumed limited visitation in its emergency departments. Please note the following details:

- Visitation is limited to one guest per patient. Patients with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 may not have a visitor.
- Exemptions to the visitation policy exist for pediatric patients, those with physical or cognitive disabilities, or individuals requiring end-of-life care.
- All visitors must participate in COVID-19 screening protocols and must wear a mask at all times.
- Administration reserves the right to suspend visitation due to patient volume or other operational considerations.
