Tomorrow is Final Day to Receive COVID-19 Vaccine at the HEC

Tomorrow, **Friday**, **Nov. 19** is the final opportunity for the children/dependents of Virtua colleagues to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at the Virtua Barry D. Brown Health Education Center (HEC) in Voorhees. Pediatric Pfizer doses are for ages 5 to 11. Click to <u>schedule an appointment</u>.

Important details to note:

- Children receiving their first dose must be accompanied by a parent/guardian—grandparents, older siblings, babysitters, and so forth are NOT acceptable alternatives. Please bring documentation that lists the minor's date of birth.
- All visitors to the HEC, including children, must wear a mask throughout their visit.

Before the month is over, COVID-19 vaccines will be available at the new Burlington County COVID-19 Vaccine Mega-Site in Mount Laurel. More information coming soon.

Long-term Study of Children with COVID-19

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has enrolled its first participant in a <u>long-term study of the</u> <u>impacts of COVID-19 on children</u>. The study aims to track up to 1,000 children and young adults who previously tested positive for COVID-19, to evaluate the impact of COVID-19 on their physical and mental health over three years, and ultimately to provide a detailed picture of COVID's effects on development, immune response, and overall quality of life in the years following infection. They also plan to track the long-term health effects of COVID to determine risk factors for complications. The study is part of the NIH's <u>Researching COVID to Enhance Recovery (RECOVER) Initiative</u>, to better understand the long-term consequences of SARS-CoV-2 infection.

CMS Update on Nursing Home Visitation

Last Friday, CMS issued an update to nursing homes that visitation can resume for all residents at all times. The <u>new guidance</u> acknowledges the many benefits of visitation, and allows for visits to be offered in a variety of ways, based on the facility's structure and residents' needs—including residents' rooms, visiting areas, and outdoors. It replaces prior guidance issued in March and May of this year. In addition, the guidance identifies core principles for infection prevention, and includes areas such as visitor and staff testing, hand hygiene, use of face coverings, and cleaning and disinfecting of high-touch areas. Further, it provides detailed updates for outdoor visitation, visitor testing and vaccination, compassionate care visits, and communal activities, among other topics. The New Jersey Department of Health has indicated that CMS-certified nursing homes must follow the CMS guidance while all long-term care facilities should continue to follow directives from <u>May 12, 2021, NJDOH directive</u> on visitation and other activities. An updated directive to reflect additional changes will be forthcoming.
