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Virtua Reaches Organ Transplant Surgery Milestone

For the 4th consecutive year, the Virtua Advanced Transplant & Organ Health team has set a new record for annual transplant volume. To date, the program has successfully completed 120 organ transplants, surpassing last year's total of 114.

"It says so much about the surgical expertise and advanced capabilities of our transplant surgeons and the clinical team," said Janine Vallen, RN, MSN, CCTN, APN-C, AVP of transplant services. "This milestone represents hope, resilience, teamwork, and the gift of new beginnings. We're beyond proud to offer these life-changing procedures to our neighbors in South Jersey."

NJ's Largest Insurer Covers Virtua's Hospital at Home Program

Many more South Jersey residents can now participate in Virtua's Hospital at Home program, thanks to an agreement Virtua recently secured with Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey. Under the new arrangement, Horizon will cover Hospital at Home for its members—who account for about 10% of Virtua patients.

Virtua is among the first nationally to provide Hospital at Home, which enables people to receive hospital-level care in the comfort of their homes. Patients in Virtua's program typically recover more quickly, with fewer complications, than those who receive traditional hospital care.

"In addition to being good for patients, Hospital at Home is also good for Virtua staffing, resource stewardship, and capacity," said Michael Capriotti, SVP of integration and strategic operations. "Our program can care for individuals with moderate, short-term health needs, [allowing] hospital-based staff to focus their time and energy on those who truly need intensive or sustained intervention."

Antibiotic Awareness Week, Nov. 18 to 24

U.S. Antibiotic Awareness Week is an annual observance aimed at raising awareness about the threat of antibiotic resistance and the importance of improving antibiotic prescribing and usage. At Virtua, we take this opportunity to highlight our Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (ASP), which is dedicated to these same principles.

"This week, the ASP emphasizes the significance of appropriate antimicrobial use in preventing antimicrobial resistance," said Martin Topiel, MD, Virtua's medical director of infection prevention and control. "This issue poses a global health threat, contributing to an estimated 35,000 deaths annually in the United States and 1.3 million deaths worldwide."

Jessica L. Mulbah, PharmD, Virtua's infectious diseases clinical pharmacist, stressed the importance of all colleagues working in unison toward antibiotic awareness. "This year's theme is 'Fighting Antimicrobial Resistance Takes All of Us,'" she said. "To help, we offer five initiatives in Virtua's antimicrobial stewardship and infection prevention to help combat antimicrobial resistance.":

- Utilization of institutional guidelines
- Reduction of the spread of antimicrobial resistance
- Administration of the shortest effective antibiotic duration
- Use of the narrowest spectrum antibiotic
- Education for patients and caregivers

Virtua Enhances Staff Safety With New Technology

Virtua is further ensuring colleague safety by introducing the Strongline Staff Safety System. This innovative technology provides staff members in select units with special badges that can be discreetly worn alongside their Virtua ID badges. In situations where a staff member feels unsafe, a simple double-press of the Strongline badge sends an immediate alert to the security team and nearby colleagues. The alert provides the individual's identity and their precise real-time location, enabling a swift and strategic response.

The Strongline system is currently being piloted in the following units of Virtua Mount Holly Hospital:

- Emergency Department
- Pediatric Emergency Department
- Behavioral Health Unit

In the months ahead, the pilot will expand to include additional emergency departments and behavioral health units.

Reviewing ACCME Integrity Standards

Standard 3: Identifying Relevant Financial Relationships

On *Clinician Update*, we've been sharing the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) Standards for Integrity and Independence in Accredited Continuing Education. The five standards are designed to ensure that CME activities are developed and delivered in a manner that is ethical, transparent, and free from commercial bias. This week we highlight Standard 3.

Standard 3 discusses how accredited providers are responsible for identifying relevant financial relationships between individuals in control of educational content and ineligible companies and managing these to ensure no commercial bias is introduced into education. Accredited providers must collect information, exclude owners or employees of ineligible companies, identify relevant financial relationships, mitigate relevant financial relationships, and disclose all relevant financial relationships to learners.
