Virtua Marks Milestone of 35,000 Robotic Surgeries – Highest in Area

Colleagues gathered at Virtua Voorhees Hospital recently to celebrate an exciting landmark: 35,000 total robotic-assisted surgeries, more than any other South Jersey health care provider.

Festivities included demonstrations of two robotic-assisted surgery systems—the da Vinci for soft tissue procedures and Mako for joint replacement. Staff and other guests got to "test drive" the robotic equipment, and several former patients came to thank their surgeons and care teams.

"The staff, the doctors, the hospital, the environment—everything is wonderful about this hospital," said Marcia Hinden, who had robotic hernia surgery at Virtua Voorhees in July by Craig Zaretsky, MD, chair of Virtua's Department of Surgery.

Robotic surgery—performed by skilled and experienced surgeons like those at Virtua—can provide better outcomes for patients, including fewer complications and faster recovery with less pain.

Syed Riaz, MD, launched the interventional pulmonology robotics program in June 2020. Virtua Marlton Hospital was the first to have this program in the South Jersey area. This technology has led to faster diagnoses, increased patient satisfaction, and improved patient outcomes. Dr. Riaz has a 100% patient satisfaction score.

Virtua Health Distributes 1,200 Free Turkeys, Fresh Produce
