Building Upon the Key Findings of the Latest Community Health Needs Assessment

All South Jersey counties have lower life expectancies than New Jersey as a whole. That is a key finding of the latest Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) finalized in 2022. The impact of the health inequities is most evident among outcomes in key areas: access to care, chronic disease, behavioral health, mental health among youth, and maternal and child health.

The qualitative research identified the following themes as the key elements impacted by the changes brought about by COVID-19 that are driving inequities in health outcomes across Burlington, Camden, and Gloucester counties:

- Transportation is worse than ever before.
- Health and human services struggle to attract new workers and retain the ones they have.
- Lack of trust in health care is at a new high.
- Workforces should better reflect the population served.

- Unexamined bias and systemic racism directly impact care.
- Isolation has had a profound and lasting impact.
- Fear remains an issue.
- People of all ages crave community but need help connecting.

"The assessment is very valuable for us, and you will see our added attention to the mentioned social determinants in the way we provide our services," said Virtua Vice President of Clinical Operations Nicole Lamborne, MD, FACOG, who participates on the multi-disciplinary team of Virtua leaders that helps formulate the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for the 2023-2025 period.

Virtua actively participates in the South Jersey Health Collaborative (SJHC), which consists of health systems and health departments within our counties. The assessment takes place every three years through a rigorous and inclusive process in accordance with the Affordable Care Act. It generates robust, shared regional data for collective action on the part of the collaborative to further the commitment to community health and population health management.

Broaching the Subject of Obesity: Identifying and Removing Potential Barriers to Success with Weight Loss

Clinicians are often challenged with broaching the topic of obesity treatment with their patients. This topic was one of several discussed when Virtua's bariatric surgery program recently hosted a learning opportunity for interested clinicians. The event, "Successfully Treat Patient Obesity: A Comprehensive Approach," featured metabolic and bariatric experts Samuel Wasser, MD, FACS, FASMBS; Emeka Acholonu, MD, FACS, FASMBS; Gaurav Sharma, MD, FACS, FASMBS; Srikanth Parsi, MD, FACS; and Michelle Hunt, Psy.D, LCADC.

Dr. Hunt, Virtua's bariatric team psychologist, provided key information on when and how to discuss weight with a patient. "Patients typically feel judged and responsible for their health problems because of their weight. They have likely been told this directly or indirectly by doctors, family, and society, which can create a dilemma for clinicians," she said. "There is not one right or wrong answer and any exact science to having 'the weight conversation.'"

Dr. Hunt offered several key points during the presentation as advice for clinicians. "Remember that your patients do not expect that you will have the quick solution to what has in many cases been a long-term or lifetime problem," she said. "Patients will often need help setting goals that are realistic or incremental."

She stressed the importance of showing empathy, support, and taking a nonjudgmental stance. "All of this can go a long way with engaging the patient's alliance with you to problem-solve their weight issue together. This approach will enhance compliance with your suggestions and referrals."

Specialized Treatment Options Available for Female Sexual Dysfunction

Pelvic conditions and sexual dysfunction are common problems among women of all ages. Virtua is the only health system in South Jersey providing specialized physical and emotional care for women experiencing pelvic discomfort or concerns related to sexual function. Our experts treat a wide range of conditions, including pelvic and vulvar pain, pain with sex, vulvar dermatological conditions, vulvodynia/vestibulodynia, and more.

"We understand that pelvic pain and sexual dysfunction influence physical and emotional health fortunately, most cases are treatable," said Virtua women's health nurse practitioner Elizabeth Kusturiss, MSN, CRNP, IF. "Our goal is to help our patients eliminate pelvic pain and restore their sexual well-being."

New Weapons Screening System Coming to Virtua Berlin

In a move to continue keeping our colleagues, patients, and visitors safe, Virtua is set to install a new weapons screening system at the Virtua Health Emergency Department in Berlin on **Monday**, **Dec. 8**. This follows the successful installation of the same system at Virtua Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital and the Virtua Health & Wellness Center – Camden.

The new metal detectors are equipped with advanced sensors, cameras, and artificial intelligence, supporting security personnel in the detection and screening of firearms and other weapons. This stateof-the-art technology effectively distinguishes between items of concern and common personal belongings such as keys and phones, doing so in real time.

Importantly, the screening equipment is designed to be discreet and efficient, ensuring that foot traffic flows smoothly. Visitors will not be required to empty their pockets or undergo a separate bag check, significantly streamlining the entry process. The system is capable of screening as many as 4,000 people per hour.
