Virtua Opens First Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders Program in South Jersey

Twenty percent of obstetrics patients experience some type of mood disorder during pregnancy or in the postpartum period. As the regional leader in obstetrical services, Virtua is working to address this mental health crisis and increase access to mental health services by launching its own Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders (PMAD) Program.

Located at the Health Education Center (HEC) in Voorhees, the PMAD program treats pregnant and postpartum patients with a wide array of mental health concerns, including (not limited to): depression, anxiety, obsessive-compulsive disorder, bipolar mood disorder, and trauma related to perinatal bereavement and NICU admissions. Program offerings include one-to-one and group therapy with licensed clinical social workers in a family-centered environment.

"As regional leaders in maternal health delivering 9,000 babies annually systemwide, Virtua is proud to address these critical needs," said Nicole Lamborne, MD, MBA, FACOG, VP of clinical operations for Women's and Children's Services. "These vital services are part of our overall commitment to provide personalized and specialized maternity care to our community."

New Jersey has seen eight cases of West Nile virus this season, including one in Camden County. Martin Topiel, MD, chief infection control officer for Virtua, spoke with CBS Philadelphia about the symptoms, the elevated risk to seniors, and a second mosquito-transmitted illness, Eastern equine encephalitis.
