
COVID-19 Clinician Update Tuesday, May 5

Virtua hospitals have successfully discharged 753 COVID/PUI inpatients.

Virtua has conducted 11,235 COVID tests.

The following charts reflect the latest figures for statewide and Virtua-site cases of COVID-19 and related response efforts.

Pulse Ox Pilot Program for COVID-19 Patients Launched

As you may have read in *New York Times,* some COVID-19 patients who appeared to be high functioning with no apparent breathing difficulties actually had "silent hypoxia." Once these patients started to decompensate, they had very difficult presentations of pneumonia from which it has been difficult to recover. Identifying and treating these patients earlier, however, has shown to improve outcomes and avoid the need for ventilators.

Beginning yesterday, May 4, patients seen in the Emergency Department at Virtua Voorhees Hospital with mild-to-moderate COVID-19 symptoms, not warranting hospitalization, are being discharged with pulse oximeters. Patients will monitor their oxygen levels while remaining in their own homes. Patients are instructed to check and record their oxygen levels throughout the day, and if they show a significant drop from their baseline, should return to the ED for treatment to prevent pneumonia. Virtua plans to quickly expand this implementation systemwide over time. (At this time, due to limits in availability of pulse oximeters nationally, the program is limited to patients seen in the ED. While symptomatic patients may be advised to purchase pulse ox from local pharmacies, there is likely to be a backorder in place.)

In another strategy, recovering COVID-19 patients will be offered the opportunity to go home from the hospital sooner, equipped with a home monitoring kit, which will include a pulse oximeter, blood pressure monitor, and ability to conduct video visits. The kit, from a company called Vivify, has been successfully used with Medicare high-risk patients by the telehealth team within LHS Health Network. For COVID-19 patients, this effort offers the chance for recovery in one's own environment while providing a way to monitor their health and to seek help at the first sign of hypoxia. A go-live date is still being scheduled, but will be available to patients who are among the covered lives in Virtua's Clinically Integrated Network.

Meeting Your Outpatient Imaging Needs

South Jersey Radiology, Larchmont Imaging, and Virtua Heath are accepting outpatients for imaging needs during the COVID Stay-at-Home Order. Patients with cancer, vascular disease, or other conditions requiring imaging should continue their care to avoid more significant complications downstream.

These patients should ideally utilize outpatient facilities for imaging (SJRA offices, Larchmont offices, Virtua outpatient facilities) for their safety and for better management of hospital resources.

- Virtua
 - Currently accepting all radiology cases
- South Jersey Radiology
 - Accepting all radiology cases other than patients with symptomatic COVID-19 or COVID-suspect. Due to limited PPE availability, those patients are being referred to Virtua for services.
 - Currently performing all scans with the exception of screening mammography, screening lung cancer CT, DEXA, and virtual colonoscopy, which will start Monday, May 11.
 - Walk-ins for X-rays are permitted, except:
 - Chest X-ray for any patient Please call for an appointment.
 - Any X-ray for symptomatic COVID-19 or COVID-suspect patient Please call for an appointment.
- Larchmont Imaging
 - Currently not seeing patients referred with possible COVID symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath)
 - Currently performing all scans with the exception of screening mammography, screening lung cancer CT, DEXA, and virtual colonoscopy, which will start Monday, May 18.
