Virtua Contributes to National Study; Two Local Families Await Joyful Reunions

At a time when we could all use a little hope, <u>meet two Virtua Voorhees patients</u> who are making remarkable recoveries from severe cases of COVID-19. These individuals are among the first people in the country to undergo a new, experimental therapy using donor-provided plasma. Virtua's Dr. Lukasz Polisiakiewicz and Dr. Eric Sztejman led a multidisciplinary team in a round-the-clock effort to attempt this promising treatment option. Not only are Virtua colleagues on the front lines of patient care; we are also on the front lines of research and clinical trials.

This heartwarming story has become an overnight news sensation, with coverage on all the local television networks and front-page articles in newspapers. <u>Watch CBS3's report here</u>.



NJ Collecting Disparities Data

Yesterday Gov. Murphy signed legislation requiring hospitals to report COVID-19 demographic data to the state Department of Health. Hospitals will now report the age, ethnicity, gender and race of all COVID-19-positive cases. Early CDC data has indicated the disparate impact of COVID-19 among African Americans, data that has been borne out in New Jersey data thus far. African Americans comprise 14 percent of the state's residents, but represent 22 percent of the more than 5,000 residents who have died from the virus.

Ear Loop Masks to be Worn by Patients During Transfers

All hospitalized and Emergency Department patients requiring transport to any area for testing, admission, or discharge will be expected to wear an ear loop mask. Likewise, any outpatients coming in for testing will also be required to wear a mask. Virtua will provide a mask to anyone entering our facilities who does not have one.
