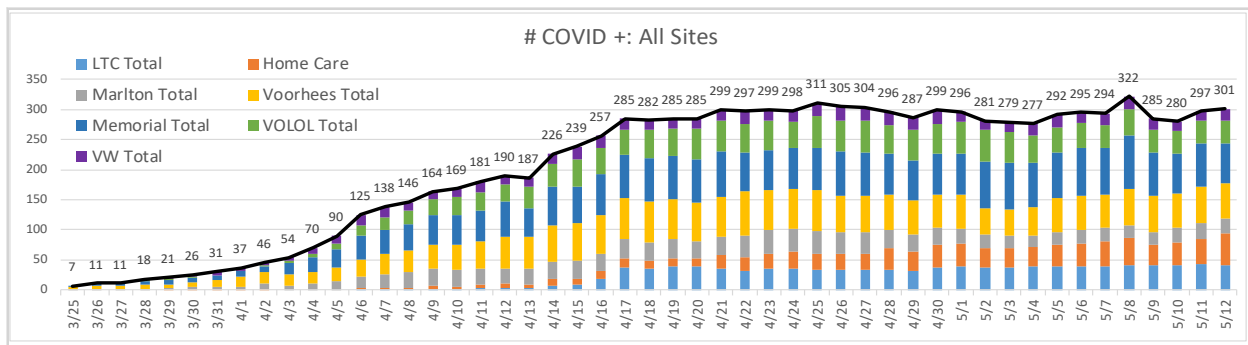


COVID-19 Clinician Update Tuesday, May 12

- Gloucester County 1,710


VPP/LSHN Webinar #12 Tonight at 6 p.m.

Keep Your Eyes to the Skies!

Tomorrow, May 13, the Air Force Reserve's 514th Air Mobility Wing based at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst will send three planes over four Virtua hospitals as it turns a regularly scheduled training mission into a salute to area health care heroes. The planes, including a C-17 Globemaster III cargo aircraft and KC-10 Extender aerial refueler, are key parts of the McGuire mission.

The first site on the flight path is Virtua Willingboro Hospital, scheduled for 1 p.m. sharp. Our friends from the Air Force emphasize that the flyover will happen quickly, and that the entire route — including Virtua Memorial, Virtua Marlton, and Virtua Voorhees — may take only 15 to 20 minutes to complete.
