






News You need to Know

- Executive order 113 formally authorizes the State Police to commandeer supplies and equipment, including N95 masks, ventilators and other PPE.
 - In a related event, the U.S. Departments of Justice and Health and Human Services announced they will distribute PPE seized from hoarders to those on the frontlines of the COVID-19 response in New York and New Jersey.
- Executive Order 112 authorizes the Division of Consumer Affairs to temporarily reactivate the licenses of recently retired healthcare professionals and grant temporary licenses to doctors licensed in foreign countries.
 - The executive order also temporarily permits certain health care professionals to perform acts outside of their ordinary scope of practice.
- To Prevent a Shortage of Possible Vital Medication
 - d. All prescriptions written for hydroxychloroquine and chloroquine for the possible treatment of COVID-19, shall be supported by a positive test result, which must be documented on the prescription and in the medical record, and shall be limited to a 14-day supply, with no refills permitted. Patients who are being treated with maintenance prescriptions for certain pre-existing conditions, such as lupus or other autoimmune diseases, may continue to obtain refills of hydroxychloroquine and chloroquine, and shall not be subject to the 14-day limitation.

Current testing performed at Virtua Voorhees Lab

- We began in-house testing at Voorhees Lab 3/31/2020 by in-house validation (NJDOH approval received) for an FDA unapproved test –PCR method
- Manufacturer of our in-house test received approval from FDA, emergency use authorization for the test on 4/2/2020
- Testing time to get results from instrument is 3 hours
- 24 specimens can be tested simultaneously



How are we controlling who gets tested

- Getting a regular supply of reagents to perform testing has been a challenge
- Currently prioritizing ED patients who are being admitted, symptomatic laboring mothers, all other testing is approved by Dr. Topiel
- We are working with other vendors to begin testing on other instruments with shorter TATs



Current testing performed at Virtua Voorhees Lab

Specimen for In-house testing is a nasopharyngeal swab in a 3 mL viral transport medium (OP swab is also acceptable)

Referral Labs

- For reference Labs such as Quest and LabCorp nasal washings are also acceptable other than NP and OP swabs
- Quest and LabCorp TAT is 4-5 days



Other tests on the market

- There are several tests being marketed by various vendors
- Most of the tests that have an high accuracy for current infection (PCR) are in short supply
- POC (looks like a pregnancy test) is being marketed by various vendors. Test detects IgG and IgM and may have a latency period in becoming positive.



FAQs

- 1. How many tests can we perform in a 24 hour period Answer : 250 provided we have enough reagents
- 2. What is the biggest barrier to do more testing Answer: availability of reagents
- 3. What is the capacity of the Drive Thru/ walk in centers Voorhees: around 130 cars (8:00-4:30, 7 days/week) Camden: around 50 persons (12:00 4:00 M-F)



How can we help our community


 ARC has reported a shortage of blood as many blood drives have been cancelled
